Stanley Kubrick, the enigmatic, highly influential and often controversial filmmaker is the inspiration for the latest project by leading British artists Jane & Louise Wilson. They have delved into the Stanley Kubrick Archive to create a 35mm film installation which is showing at BFI Southbank Gallery from February next year. The Gallery installation is commissioned by Animate Projects and the BFI with The Kubrick Archive, University of the Arts, London. It opens at BFI Southbank Gallery on 13 February 2009.

Jane & Louise Wilson have focused on Kubrick's *Aryan Papers* project, a film about the Holocaust that Kubrick researched in great detail for many years, but which he never made.

The exhibition coincides with a major retrospective of Stanley Kubrick films taking place at BFI Southbank.
