Digitalis Commissions: Open call for inquiring animations

Animate Projects, with support from the Jerwood Charitable Foundation, announce four new commissions for animated works that explore, question, subvert or confound our expectations of art and the 'digital'.

Applicants should consider ideas that examine the textures and materials of digital practice. We are looking for ideas that consider the digital exhibition context: that explore the technology and the intimacy of the viewing platform (the laptop, tablet or smartphone).

The works will be shown online - at animateprojects.org - and on other digital platforms, including Vimeo and iTunes from November 2011. The online exhibition of the Digitalis Commissions will also include interviews with the artists.

We are looking to commission four works, at a budget of £2,000 each, including artist's fee. The commissions are available to UK-based artists, animators and filmmakers who can craft an inventive and engagingly provocative work.

The works will be selected by a Jury comprising of: Abigail Addison, Assistant Director, Animate Projects; Nick Bradshaw, Web Editor, Sight & Sound Magazine; Susan Collins, artist and Director of the Slade School of Fine Art; Gary Thomas, Director, Animate Projects; and Sarah Williams, Coordinator, Jerwood Visual Arts.

The commissions are part of Digitalis, a strand of activities for 2011 that have a focus on the potential of the digital space as a site for artistic production. Animation is at the forefront of digital innovation, in creative and scientific fields, and Digitalis offers a pause for thought about what the impact of digital might mean.

Digitalis

Digitalis is a provocative strand that sets out to explore, question, subvert or confound our expectations of art and 'the digital', and intended as a focus on and further debate around the potential of the digital space as a site for artistic production. Animation is at the forefront of digital innovation, in creative and scientific fields, and Digitalis offers a pause for thought about what the impact of digital might mean.

The strand includes: Animate OPEN: Digitalis, an online exhibition of up to ten existing works; Digitalis Commissions: four new works for online exhibition, supported by the Jerwood Charitable Foundation; Digitalis Dialogue: a screening and panel event, a free publication featuring critical writing and information about the commissioned and exhibited works, and a discussion event.

Sebastian Buerkner was also specially commissioned to produce the Digitalis artwork featured above. The work will be available to purchase as a limited-edition print from the Animate Projects Shop from July.

Susan Collins

Susan Collins is one of the UK's leading artists working with digital media. Collins works across public, gallery and online spaces. Works include Tate in Space (a BAFTA nominated Tate netart commission); Seascape, commissioned by Film and Video Umbrella, exhibited at the De La Warr Pavilion; and Love Brid, commissioned by Animate Projects for Sea Change. Susan Collins is currently Director of the Slade School of Fine Art, University College London where she established the Slade Centre for Electronic Media in Fine Art in 1995.
