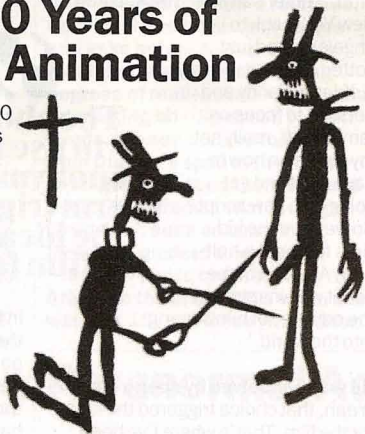


AnimateTV: 20 Years of Experimental Animation

AnimateTV was established in 1990 as a collaboration between the Arts Council and Channel 4. Since then, it's ensconced itself within the channel's small-hours scheduling, peddling a brand of animation notable for its dark humour and restless, relentless inventiveness. Don't expect much in the way of Hanna Barbera high jinks here – these 23 selected films are unashamedly artful, adult fare that implicitly call for a reappraisal of what the form is capable of. That's not to say that parts of this collection aren't extremely funny – David Shrigley and Chris Shepherd's 'Who I Am and What I Want' is a masterpiece of hilarious abjection. The stand-out is probably Run Wrake's astonishing, bad-trippy 'Rabbit', which muses on greed but throws in dozens of queasy visual
